Budget and Finance: Looking for a chairperson.

Education: New school board has been seated; many good questions are coming up; budget is being discussed as it is very slim; will be reviewing priorities for the year; February meeting hoping to invite the at large school board members - please bring any issues to the committee.

Environment & Recreation/Planning & Zoning:

Joint meeting with planning and zoning minutes are published in the record. Lynne Strobel from Walsh Colucci attended, and they discussed 2560 and 2550 Huntington building status. They are looking to have those two properties developed into residential with some mixed use. Both of these properties are currently zoned for office, with 2560 currently built out as an office building, the other is vacant land. They are continuing to work with the county to resolve some issues. Then they will come back to us with some more information. Looks like there will possibly be a public meeting in March. The committee will be writing a letter to the developer to disagree with their ideas about the Community Center and the artificial turf. We do not support the county's idea for second floor retail at 2550. Additional details are as published in the record.

Fairfax Federation: Having their annual dinner party meeting on the 21st and we will not have a representative attending.

Transportation: As printed in the Record

Treasurer:

The Treasurer's report, as published in the December Record, was unanimously accepted.

Membership: 41 associations have joined this year. We are working with other organizations to encourage them to join. Community members asked if there was a list of community members available to the group. The list of member organizations is posted on our website.

SFDC: The urban land institute is doing a study for place making along Richmond highway and that'll be at the end of January beginning of February. SFDC received a grant. We

were approved by Fairfax County to do temporary murals in the form of banners on the fencing that will go up along Richmond highway as buildings are torn down and construction is getting ready for Rt1 expansion. Instead of having people just drive down the highway and see nothing but chain link fencing everywhere we're going to have some temporary murals that will go up. The panel design has not yet been selected at this time. Per Nick, from Supervisor Storck's office there is a panel for selection of murals.

Stormwater: The county is still working on a policy to form a grant program that would help homeowners and communities of interest; which are usually HOA's with their storm water problems. This will be a 50/50 of sharing arrangement up to \$5000. County staff is suggesting a \$250,000 budget for 2024. \$50K would go toward the management of it which bring the total for the grant to \$200k. We have a small committee now not a representative of each organization and we would like to have all member organizations comment if possible. If you would like to have a copy of that please let me know.

Co-Chairs Report

January we will have at our general council meeting the president of Inova Mount Vernon Hospital participate and talk to us about where they are with things happening at the hospital. Please spread the word. February 10th is the town hall meeting with Supervisor Storck. We have asked for three eightfoot tables to be put together - one to be used for storm water and the others for other Mt Vernon Council items. We have asked to be placed where we would have electrical access to hook up to computers.

Resolutions for vote:

Supervisor Storck:

Supervisor Storck thanked the council members who came to the 2024 BOS swearing in ceremony. Nick has sent the spreadsheet for current development projects to the communities. The Penn Daw comprehensive plan amendment has a process for amending the plan to be able to do the fire station, emergency housing and the affordable housing at the Hybla Valley nursery site. We have a lot of steps to go through before we are ready to move forward with these projects and hold public hearings. BOS committee assignments will be announced sometime in January. He is currently the environmental chair and the chair of the audit committee. He is expecting to either keep one or both of those and could also get something else. He expects to continue to serve on the VRE committee and will serve as treasurer. He also expects to

continue on the Virginia Association of Counties board as the Chair of the Finance Committee. Based upon the long-drawnout permitting process for small businesses, he has asked the county to take a look at our permit process to make it easier and faster for these permits to be approved.

The George Washington Parkway speed enforcement is a major issue and think we all need to keep the heat on for this issue. Grand opening of the Arden and North Hill residences are coming soon. The Woodlawn Fire Station has been LEED certified with the installation of solar panels.

The American Horticultural Society celebrated its 50th - will enjoy the fact that it's saved, and you see a reinvigorated board. He always thinks of MVCCA because of the work that was done. Waiting for the board to add a development easement or protection so that it can't be resold.

Huntington metro station --we have a key issue with the connection between Huntington metro and the bus transit system where buses go down N kings highway and people have to go up a couple of escalators and/or stairs that are exposed to the elements. This needs to be an underground connection which will cost millions of dollars. WMATA has not been very supportive but they're open to it as long as somebody pays for it.

Community member question: What is \$100,000 that is supposed to be provided to the Gum Springs Museum which was contingent upon the museum receiving \$200,000 from the state. What is the county's criteria for the museum to receive that \$100,000 or more from Fairfax County?

A: Fairfax County is a match; I've talked to the County Executive and Carla Bruce about it. They've advised me that they've already provided that through some of the other work that they have done. Once I have more details, I'll share them with you.

MOUNT VERNON COUNCIL OF CITIZENS' ASSOCIATIONS (MVCCA) RESOLUTION E&R-2024-01 COMMENT ON THE DRAFT FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT (FNSI) DEFENSE INTELLIGENCE AGENCY HEADQUARTERS ANNEX, CONNECTOR ROADS, FORT **BELVOIR, VIRGINIA**

Whereas, on December 19, 2023, the MVCCA was notified of the availability of the draft FNSI for the connector roads for the Defense Intelligence Agency for the Fort Belvoir North Areas (FBNA).

Whereas, our reading of the draft FNSI is confusing in stating that there is no significant impact but that air emissions would have adverse effects and traffic would incur short term adverse effects (see Page 2),

Whereas, the presence of adverse effects should be a significant impact unless otherwise explained and defined (which was not provided in the draft FNSI), and

Whereas, while the determination that there are no wetlands on the project site, a reference with the criteria for this determination was not provided.

Therefore, be it resolved, the report should be clarified so that it does not have conflicting language finding adverse effects with a finding of no significant impact, and

Be it further resolved that either a report that cites the use of the criteria for the determination that no wetlands are present at the site or the criteria for the determination that there are no wetlands.
