Fairfax County is building a community resiliency network to provide critical assistance to people in need in the event of a disaster. Disasters happen, frequently without warning, and the impact can be devastating. With planning and preparation, we can be ready to help ourselves and others impacted by disasters recover quickly. It is important to note that a disaster does not have to be large or wide spread to result in serious impact to individuals, families, organizations, and businesses.

The Community Resiliency Group (CRG) program represents a coordinated voluntary effort, initiated by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors and led by the Office of Emergency Operations (OEM), to network County resources, community volunteer organizations, and business groups throughout the County to improve preparedness and resilience, and to ensure that post-disaster recovery happens as quickly and completely as possible.

In addition to being better able to assist those affected by disasters, the CRG can help improve preparedness for your organization and members.
