Purpose

The Public Safety Committee is a standing committee of the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations (MVCCA). The Public Safety Committee is an interface for information flow between the Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations and the Fairfax County public safety organizations. The Public Safety Committee also advocates for the security and safety needs of the residents of the Mount Vernon District.

When appropriate, the Committee drafts positions and resolutions which, if adopted, become the position of the MVCCA, and publishes meeting reports and pertinent information in each issue of the MVCCA RECORD. Adopted resolutions related to Public Safety can be found in the MVCCA Resolution Tracker.

The MVCCA Policy and Procedures Manual (PPM) states “The July meeting of each Standing committee should be an organizational meeting. The Committee’s goals and objectives for the year ahead should be developed and recorded for publication in the next (September) RECORD.”

This document is what the committee uses to communicate our annual work plan with committee objectives, responsibilities, and actions.

Pedestrian Safety on Route One

Problem:

- Dangerous Intersection at Route One and Ft Hunt Rd because of barely visible islands; confusing markings on turn lanes; poorly marked pedestrian crossings; islands too small to serve as safe standing places for pedestrians/bikers.
- There are few measures to protect those trying to make east-west crossing on Route one.
- Sidewalks too narrow and too close to the highway.

What Needs to be Done and When:

- Need a VDOT and FCDOT Briefing – **Completed 4 Feb 2021**
- Need more crosswalk zones with lights.
- Traffic Calming?? Lane width reduction?
- Over/Under passes?

Target Date for Draft Resolution:

Status:

- Ms Claudia Llana from VDOT briefed the intersection at Ft Hunt and Route one at the 11/9 Transportation committee meeting. Her brief was in response to a MVCCA resolution in May of 2019 about the intersection. Meeting attendees urged Claudia to continue assessment of the intersection for safety improvements.
- Resolution adopted to reduce the speed limit to 35mph.
- VDOT and FCDOT invited/scheduled to brief on 4 Feb 21.
- Briefing completed and copy posted on the MVCCA PS webpage.
- Considering follow-on action for Ft Hunt/Route 1 intersection. When going from Ft Hunt Rd across Route 1 to get to Old Richmond Highway it is hard to see the island that has to be passed.

Police Reform or Law Enforcement Reform

Problem:

- Address any training issues that may be needed on de-escalation techniques and dealing with people with mental health issues.
- Response to mental health issues.
- Use of force changes? Civilian Oversight?

What Needs to be Done and When: Stay involved with the Fairfax County PC Committee activity.

Status:

- See Ad Hoc Police Practices Review Commission Final Report of October 8, 2015 for the 202 recommended actions that addressed five categories – Communications; Recruitment Diversity Vetting; Mental Health and Crisis Intervention; Use of Force; and Independent Oversight and Investigation.
- See Final Report on Fairfax County Police Reform Ad Hoc Police Practices Review Commission Implementation Group, October 10, 2018 that showed 179 recommendation implemented or being implemented, 5 actions still under review, and 18 actions not to be implemented.
- On 17 Dec 20, Bill Kane met with Supervisor Lusk and two of his staffers for introductions and to get his view of public safety issues since he is the Chairman of the

BoS Public Safety committee. He has done a lot of work in the area of law enforcement reform.

- At 6 Apr 21 FC PS Committee meeting, Supervisor Lusk began review of Near-term items from his Public Safety Community Input Matrix. It appears this will be the forum for reviewing and deciding on actions to be instituted for police reform in the County.
- The University of Texas at Austin study on Use of Force in Fairfax County is expected in May 2021.
- Attended the May meeting of the Civilian Review Panel and Independent Police Auditor to get a sense of what they do and how well they do it.

Police Morale

- What is status of MOU between the Park Police and Fairfax County to allow FCPD to help policing the GW Parkway?

Target Date for Draft Resolution: 1 June 2021.

Status:

- Per Captain Ruck at the December 2020 PS committee meeting, FCPD does not have the staffing to permit assistance to the NPS which retains responsibility for policing the GW Parkway. We need to see the NPS report of their study on GW Parkway safety.
- The NPS Safety Study for the Southern GW Parkway was presented at the 5 April 21 joint meeting of Transportation and Public Safety.
- The study provided little on enforcement. Follow up questions being collected by Transportation committee. Resolution on enforcement being generated by PS committee.
