

The Mount Vernon Council of Citizens' Associations (MVCCA) has been a pivotal organization in the Mount Vernon District since 1969, when it was established as an independent 501(c)(4) to advocate for essential services like public safety, schools and fire stations along the Richmond Highway Corridor. Today, the MVCCA continues to work closely with my office and County staff to help guide growth in our District that aligns with our community and environmental priorities, transportation needs and smart economic development.

I am pleased to say that their members are active in addressing the County Executive's proposed budget annually and routinely testify before the Board of Supervisors Budget and School Board hearings; making the case for funding that really matters for the Mount Vernon District.

Their committees are made up of representatives from the many HOAs, Condo and Civic Associations across the District. These volunteers carefully review proposed developments and changes to ensure that decisions made by developers and County staff keep our community in mind.
